Description of Activities

Boylston Chess Foundation, Inc. was formed for exclusively charitable and educational purposes. The Foundation is an educational community organization formed to educate and instruct children and the Greater Boston Community in the game and appreciation of chess, emphasizing sportsmanship, collaborative learning, individual responsibility, respect for others and the development of and commitment to continuous community involvement and learning.

Volunteer coaches plan and direct seminars and clinics, teaching children and other new members the basics of chess and encouraging the development of collaborative learning skills. Additionally, the Foundation hosts quarterly masters' seminars, at which prominent chess players share their knowledge and provide instruction. The Foundation also sponsors level-appropriate matches between members of the Foundation and other entrants, in which members compete in a supportive environment. The volunteer directors and officers provide rules, structure, and organization, giving an organized and adult-supervised forum for children to participate in the Foundation's chess instruction during otherwise unscheduled and unsupervised leisure time. In addition, parents of children participating in the Foundation's programs, particularly working parents, will benefit from knowing that their children are involved in a productive activity, rather than aimless, sedentary and possibly counterproductive "hanging out."

Membership

(a) Membership requirements, fees, and dues.

Boylston Chess Foundation, Inc., does not have corporate members and otherwise is not a membership organization in terms of corporate governance. However, its players must register and become "members" of the Foundation.

Anyone may participate in the activities and tournaments offered by the Boylston Chess Foundation. Generally, one must register and pay dues to participate in the Foundation, but those who are not able to afford the dues are eligible for financial assistance from the Foundation. The Foundation does not discriminate based on race or sex.

The registration fee for six months' membership is \$70 per person, or \$125 for one family for one year. Those who are under 18 ("juniors") and over 65 ("seniors") are able to join for a 20% discounted rate.

(b) Efforts to attract members.

The Foundation will primarily attract members through word of mouth. It will also distributes notices of its seminars, clinics and tournaments to neighborhood businesses, community organizations, schools, churches and libraries, and publish notice of the same in local newspapers.

(c) Benefits received for dues payment.

By paying dues, one becomes a member of the Boylston Chess Foundation and may participate in seminars, clinics, and games. In that context, a member may take advantage of the Foundation's equipment (e.g., chess boards, timers and facilities) and staff (e.g., volunteer teachers and guest expert speakers), as well as the seminars offered by the Foundation. Involvement with the Foundation teaches members analytical thinking skills, good sportsmanship, and collaborative effort. Membership in the Foundation enhances mental fitness and provides members, especially its disadvantaged youth members, with an opportunity to interact socially with their peers and with the community in a supportive, fun environment. Members of the Foundation and their families are also invited to an annual Foundation championship tournament.
